Amy Dowdy graduated from West Georgia College, where she became a Christian and was involved with Campus Outreach. She and her husband Jeff helped start the CO ministry in Brazil in 1977 and served there for eight years. After years spent in the marketplace in the U.S., they are returning to the mission field to work alongside an indigenous church and build Brazilian laborers.

"God has been shaping us as a family, preparing us to return and serve in this capacity", says Amy. Detoured from launching abroad, they used this season to lead a team doing local outreach at UAB and the University of Montevallo.

# Go Where He Leads

Laying in a hospital bed after a year of cancer treatment, Guong received more devastating news. At the age of 24, his life would soon come to an end. His life felt incomplete, but through the physical pain and spiritual anguish, God delivered hope. Guong's sister, Houng, was a student at Khon Kaen University when she experienced the Gospel through Campus Outreach. Her life changed dramatically but sharing Christ with family members was a challenge. When Houng learned of her brother's diagnosis, she felt compelled to speak. On March 6, 2020, Houng, with the help of CO staff, explained the Gospel to her dying brother. With a softened heart, he proclaimed Jesus as Lord and embraced the hope of eternal life in Christ. Guong longed to attend a church service before his death, but the onset of COVID-19 suspended services and his condition continued to decline.

For two weeks, fellow believers brought the church to him. CO students and staff rotated visiting hours to read scripture and unpack God's truth. Local church members joined Guong in prayer for his friends and family to know Jesus. Just 16 days after surrendering his life to Christ, Guong died.

His decision however, continues to impact those who hear his story.

To honor their son's last wish his parents planned a Christian funeral together with the Campus Outreach hub church. Sitting six feet apart and wearing masks, 70 of Guong's Thai Buddhist family and friends gathered to mourn his loss. They learned about the new life Guong gained and Guong's parents heard the Gospel for the first time. Afterward, his mom continued to ask her daughter about God and the reason she believed in Him. After a few weeks, the mom accepted Christ and started attending church!

After the new school year started for Thai college students, Guong's younger brother, Heng, became the fourth person in their family who accepted Christ. Praise God for his faithfulness to call to Himself not only Guong, but also his mom and his younger brother!

As Guong is experiencing God's fullness in heaven, we celebrate Christ's continued work on earth. We can't anticipate how the Holy Spirit will advance the Gospel, but as a ministry, God prepares us to go where He leads.



### Serving in Greater Ways

John and Melody Hunt have touched many lives around the world through their ministry. After serving the CO ministry in Thailand for 25 years, they joined our strategic global work four years ago. Uniquely gifted to care for others, they helped develop a Member Care Team that has grown to include indigenous staff from three continents and to provide critical support for our leaders through the COVID pandemic. As the demand for counseling and loving support has greatly increased, God has helped this team rise to the challenge to serve sacrificially with a spiritual focus and dependence on the Lord.

"It is a blessing to be able to continually point ourselves and our staff to the Gospel. God is in control even when all seems chaotic. Trusting in God and being transformed into the image of his Son often happens to a greater degree in the midst of challenges and difficulties. It has been a challenge to meet the increased needs but also a joy to come alongside our leaders in their hour of need. ### In the Middle of the Storm

Antjuan Marsh was a talented defensive lineman on the Troy University football team in the 1980s. While at Troy, Antjuan came to Christ through a relationship with a Campus Outreach staff and was discipled and developed as a leader.

For the last thirty years, Antjuan Marsh has given his life towards making a difference in public education as an educator and principal.

Recently, the State Board of Education asked him to lead one of the largest schools in the state. They believed he could do a great work there. Located in the heart of Montgomery, Robert E. Lee High School is predominantly black and has a long history of providing a diverse student body with quality education.

The school became a target recently when protesters toppled the statue of Robert E. Lee. The very next day, a group of angry alumni came and wanted to protest the previous day's events.

In the middle of the storm, Antjuan was able to facilitate conversation between these groups and share the Gospel. He shared, "Our students are dealing with a lot of things. As a school leader, my primary purpose is to do my job well, making the best collaborative decisions for our students. Because of uncertainty, people are scared. I am praying against fear and panic, knowing that chaos and uncertainty lessen when the Gospel is spread and people believe."

### Antjuan is bringing the peace and hope of Christ into a situation filled with hate.

The Lord is showing us that He is at work through many leaders like Antjuan, men and women prepared to make a critical difference in this time. This is why we engage in this work.

Campus Outreach develops young people that years from now will provide influence in education, government, and every segment of society. By God's grace and leading, Campus Outreach develops diverse Gospel leaders that will lead towards reconciliation and justice.


# **LEADership Pipeline**

In addition to providing support for our international and U.S. regions, new expansion teams are being sent to London, England, and Athens, Greece.

The youngest of six children in my family, I grew up in St. Louis going to a camp where we reenacted the crucifixion. I remember thinking WHY... are we doing this to Jesus and then one day realizing it is me too - I am the one doing this.

God later led me to college at Murray State University in Kentucky where on moving day I met someone from the Campus Outreach hub church. CO students and staff took me in quickly and it was great. From freshman to graduation, I participated in New Year Conferences, Summer Leadership Projects - and fell deeper in love with the Lord, and with the vision of the ministry.

Two years ago, I went to South Africa on a cross-cultural project. Ministering to black South African students I was saddened to hear they look at Christianity as "white man's religion". I am black and cannot imagine my life outside of my Christian faith. I asked the Lord what he wanted me to do with the needs he showed me there and he sparked my desire to serve with CO in Zambia. I am giving God my "yes, wherever you send me and want me to go, I will go."



Ready to

Shelby was close to graduation at the University of Central Oklahoma when she felt God's call to serve in missions overseas. She was involved with Student Mobilization, a college ministry that partners with CO SERVE to send leaders to overseas missions. "I applied for many jobs, not knowing where God was leading. What gave me confidence that CO aligned with my vision was the focus on college students and future leaders combined with working under the authority of a local church. I had seen first hand how God had used both of those to grow me."

After serving with CO in Khon Kaen and Udon Thani, Thailand for two years, Shelby chose to continue to serve the nations through our CO SERVE Team.

"I prayed to remain open and faithful to God's guidance. When my prayer to continue to serve in Thailand was answered with a closed door, God reminded me of all the people that cared for me and how that enabled me to do my job well and stay healthy on the field. I was humbled meeting missionaries from other organizations who had no framework for the personal development opportunities CO SERVE provides. I'm excited to play a part in that all over the world. We don't want to just send missionaries, we want to send healthy, well-equipped missionaries, and the CO SERVE teams enable us to do that."
